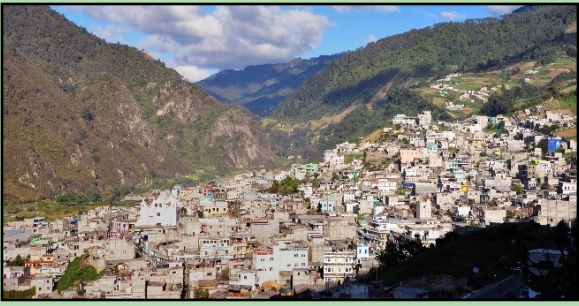
AELC 4710/6710: AELC Study Tour (2 credit hours)
