



Central American Literature and Culture

Program Description:

Experience the history and culture of Nicaragua! This program provides students with an on-the-ground understanding of the cultural and natural richness of one of the most intriguing and diverse nations in Latin America. It includes coursework on Central America's history and cultural production from pre-Columbian times to the present, with visits to key natural and historical sites as part of students' work. Along with staying in the beautiful colonial cities of León and Granada, we will see the natural wonders of the northern towns of Estelí, Jinotega, and Matagalpa, view Mayan relics on Ometepe Island, and visit the Masaya market and volcano.

FLS 4990/6990: Cultural Research in Central America (3 credit hours)

Requirements:

Students must have at least a 2.5 GPA and have taken FLS 3113: Advanced Spanish Composition or have a graduate standing in Foreign Language. This course will fulfill an upper division literature credit for FLS majors. All students with a strong foundation in Spanish are encouraged to apply.
