



Gender and Film in Greece

Program Description:

From 300 to Mama Mia!, Zorba to My Big Fat Greek Wedding, Troy to Before Midnight, Greece and Greek culture has been represented in US and foreign films since the 1950s. This class will explore cultural and political discourses of gender and its intersections with sexuality, race and ethnicity, socio economic status, and religion in film. Students will encounter and engage Greek culture with an eye toward critical analysis. Through visits to museums, historic and archaeological sites, and film landmarks, students will gain a fuller understanding of the influence of Greece on popular culture.

CO/GS 6990/4990: Gender and Film in Greece

Requirements:
