



State In Greece

Program Description:

Join us and explore the birth of reason in ancient Greece. We will spend 16 days in Greece and visit the site of the ancient Olympic Games, the Temple of Apollo, the Acropolis, Plato's Academy, Aristotle's Lyceum, and other ancient sites in this spectacular country. In Athens, we will use the campus of Hellenic American College, and we will take excursions to Olympia, Delphi, Epidaurus, Mycenae, and the islands Aegina, Poros, and Hydra. While exploring Greece, the course will focus on the first attempts, which were made by philosophers in ancient Greece, to use rational thought, rather than myths and storytelling, to understand the world and human nature.

PHI 2290: Ancient Greece and the Birth of Reason (3 credit hours)

Requirements:

All students with at least a 2.5 GPA are welcome to participate in this program. This course will satisfy a general philosophy elective for PHI majors and a Humanities General Education elective for all students.
