

Tropical Veterinary Medicine & One Health in Uganda

Program Description:

This course focuses on One Health. international animal production health management, disease surveillance, public health systems, food safety and and multi-national cultural security, exposure. The course is delivered in collaboration with Makerere University in Kampala, Uganda and uses experiential field trips (i.e. farms, field experiment stations and national parks). There is a cultural boma (workshop) and international conference during the last week.

CVM 5906/4990/6990: Tropical Veterinary Medicine & One Health in Uganda (6 credit hours)

Requirements:

This course is open to Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) students, graduate, and undergraduate students, particularly Pre-Veterinary Medicine students or those interested in health related careers. All students with at least a 2.5 GPA and sophomore standing are welcome to participate in this program.
