• Association of Teachers of Japanese Bridging Project: The Bridging Project offers scholarships to American undergraduate students participating in study abroad programs in Japan. All majors are eligible. https://www.aatj.org/studyabroad/japan-bridging-scholarships

• Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program: U.S. citizen undergraduates, in good academic standing, who receive a Federal Pell Grant, will be attending an approved program and will study abroad for at least 21 days in the same country. The Program especially supports students with high financial need, students with diverse ethnic backgrounds, and students with disabilities. • Boren Awards for International Study: Provides American undergraduate students with the resources and encouragement they need to acquire skills and experiences in areas of the world critical to the future security of our nation, in exchange for their commitment to seek work in the federal government. The program focuses on geographic areas, languages, and fields of study deemed critical to U.S. national security. http://www.borenawards.org/

• **DAAD Undergraduate Scholarship**: The goal of this program is to support study abroad in Germany and at German universities. Scholarships are available either as part of an organized study abroad program or as part of an individual, student-designed study abroad semester or year. https://www.daad.org/en/find-funding/scholarship-database/

• Freeman-ASAI: Freeman-ASIA accepts applications from U.S. citizens or permanent residents studying at the undergraduate level at a two-year or four-year college or university who demonstrate financial need to study abroad in East or Southeast Asia. http://www.iie.org/en/Programs/Freeman-ASIA

• Fund for Education Abroad- General Scholarship: Fund for Education Abroad awards are intended to support students planning to participate in high-quality, rigorous education abroad programs in the academic year or summer. Applicants must be US citizens or permanent residents currently enrolled as undergraduates in US universities/colleges who plan to study abroad for at least four weeks. https://fundforeducationabroad.org/scholarships/

• Fund for Education Abroad- Hilary Echo Douglas Memorial Scholarship: This scholarship will be awarded to a student who demonstrates Hilary's love for Vietnam and other cultures, her desire to give back to the world community, and her contagious love of life. Applicants must be

• Fund for Education Abroad- Rainbow Scholarship: This scholarship will be awarded to a deserving LGBTQI student who aims to participate in a high-quality, rigorous education abroad program. Applicants must meet general FEA scholarship eligibility requirements & preferences. • Golden Key Study Abroad Scholarship: Those eligible are undergraduate, graduate, and postgraduate members enrolled in a study abroad program or in the academic year immediately after the award. You must be a member of the Golden Key International Honour Society to apply. https://scholarships.goldenkey.org/

• Phi Kappa Phi Study Abroad Grants: Phi Kappa Phi Study Abroad Grants are designed to help support undergraduates as they seek knowledge and experience in their academic fields by studying abroad. You do not need to be a member to apply. Must have a GPA of at least a 3.75. www.phikappaphi.org/studyabroad

• Walter Jensen Scholarship for Study Abroad: Applicant must be enrolled in an established teacher education program in French. Students should be studying abroad for one semester or year in any francophone country. Must be a U.S. Citizen, non-native speaker of French, and sponsored by an AATF member teacher.
